## **Shared Care Planning**

Every WPC enrollee must have a comprehensive shared care plan within 30 days of enrollment. Participants will discuss how their Pilots are meeting this requirement in terms of care team models and workflows, care management technology, and user access levels.

## **Patient Consent Management**

Pilots are designing new forms and processes to authorize sharing of health information between WPC partners. Participants will discuss different approaches to the consent process, including electronic storage and access to consent status across WPC partners.

Intrepid Ascent will present an overview of current HIE models, sharing examples from Pilots in Marin, Sacramento, and San Joaquin. Participants will have the opportunity to ask questions and discuss their Pilot's approach to HIE with peers.
