# PCS #265637: Correction to Q-SC3

- Q: 3 codes were added to Rate 1 for CAD diagnosis but these codes weren't added to Rate 2. I21.9 Acute myocardial infarction, unspecified I21.A1 Myocardial infarction type 2 I21.A9 Other myocardial infarction type Was this intentional and if so, why add to rate 1 and not rate 2? (Interestingly these codes were not added to SC2: CAD Antiplatelet Therapy which is also stewarded by AHA).
- A: The measure steward, American Heart Association, and CMS have confirmed that both Rate 1 and Rate 2 should contain identical ICD-10 codes (i.e., both rates should include these three added denominator codes). This has been corrected in the 2020 MIPS specification and will be incorporated in the next version of the QIP Reporting Manual.
- FYI: this correction will not be seen in the QIP manuals until PY4, but since it is a correction, it should be applied to PY3 and PY3.5

- Please review the differences between the PY<sub>3.5</sub> Target Population (Column K) and the PY<sub>4</sub>-8 Target Population (Column L). Font is in green for metrics' for which the Target Pop is the same in both columns.
- Please review Numerators and Denominators (Columns O & P). Cells are highlighted in yellow if they PY4-8 is different from PY3.5. Specific changed language is in red font, but must be viewed directly in the cell (red font doesn't show in the formula window). Expand cell to full size to see red font.
- Metrics on rows 45-47 are flagged with comments to note that each metric combines the ages used in the native metrics from the CMS Core Adult & Child Sets. Core set specs are the same except for age ranges.
- Target Population definitions
  - 1. MCMC Assigned Lives. Excludes Duals. (53 metrics)
  - 2. MCMC beneficiary as of the date(s) of the of the denominator event(s). Excludes Duals. (9 metrics)
  - 3. Medi-Cal beneficiary as of the date(s) of the denominator event(s). Includes MCMC Assigned Lives, MCMC non-assigned Lives and FFS Medi-Cal. Excludes Duals (17 metrics)
  - 4. Payer Agnostic (9 metrics)

# **QIP 3.0 Readiness Summit Postponed**
