## **PY4 Programmatic Updates**

- Oct 29: DHCS released updated PY4 Benchmarks via email.
- Ongoing: PY<sub>4</sub> negotiations with DHCS & CMS
- Pending: CMS approval of original PY<sub>4</sub> pre-print
- Pending: Details from DHCS on Audit

## **QPP Eligible Clinicians**

- The <u>MIPS Eligible Clinician Types</u> limitation is used to specify who is eligible to participate in MIPS. Since that rule <u>does not apply to QIP</u>, DHCS has agreed with NCQA and SNI to replace "Eligible clinicians" with "**QIP entities**" in all the QPP measures for PY5.
- This allows the entity to maximize the care team by applying the Non-Clinician Care Team Member Guidance in the General Guidelines to "determine the appropriate care team member(s) to conduct a given service measured by each QIP measure".
- Furthermore, this change applies starting PY4, so "Eligible Clinicians" in all the QPP specs can now be interpreted as "QIP entities".

## **QIP Reporting Application Access Window**

SNI has heard that members may feel that they need more than a month of lead time to submit their PY4 reports and as such request that the QIP Reporting Application be opened earlier than one month prior to the June 15 reporting deadline.

## **SNI Series: Measuring Success in Virtual Care**

In August, PHS completed a virtual care maturity self-assessment which SNI used to design a three-part webinar series to help PHS advance their virtual care capabilities.

#### Defining Measures of Success in Virtual Care. Nov 15, 12-1pm.

SMEs from Coleman Associates will help participants define measures of success (aka KPIs) to standardize measurement and align virtual care strategy across their organizations. Participants will consider examples of virtual care KPIs and begin to identify their own virtual care goals. #### Optimizing Access and Reducing the Backlog in Primary Care. Dec 16, 12-1pm
